The gifts I have received since moving into Tikvah Home for Men are: Faith, Knowledge

and Direction.

A Safe, Warm and Beautiful Place to Call "Home": For years I haven't lived in the safest or greatest places. Tikvah has changed that for me here and now.

A "Family" and Support. People I can call my "brothers": For various reasons (location, life-choices, etc.) my biological family and I are distant for the most part.

A Sense of Freedom and Peace: There are many forms of incarceration and bondage (physical, mental and spiritual). At Tikvah, I'm learning to feel again and with work, feeling what these freedoms truly are.

Acceptance: People in my life that accept my story and myself: They show me love, grace and forgiveness because they want to see growth and success. I now have been gifted with the acceptance of others as well. No matter the person place or situation, I'm learning to accept them as God's bigger plan not always mine. Who am I to question God? I still struggle with acceptance and God's plan even today.

The gift of hope: After coming to Tikvah, spending time listening to others, and actually implementing the "3 W's", I'm starting to see results. The "3 W's are: Willing, Want it, Work for it. There can actually be a "life" after incarceration and addiction. I have hope now that my past will not define me forever. I now have hope in my present where I can continue to recover, grow and improve my today. I actually hope to have a bright future. I don't have to die a dope fiend on the streets.

An Introduction to Jesus Christ: Since coming to Tikvah, I have been given the opportunity to build a relationship with my Lord and Savior.

People In My Life To Walk with Me in My Path to Seek The Lord: Pastor Todd Bolton from Willoughby Bible Church (next door to Tikvah), works with me personally every week. He introduced me to the Bible and through scripture based workbooks I am able to gain more of an understanding which helps me to strengthen my relationship with Christ. Pastor Todd shows me patience, caring and understanding. He answers my questions, gives me quidance and allows me to challenge him when we work together. Pastor Todd does this with me so I may discover the love of Christ. That is a gift in itself.
