Community Service

At Friends of Recovery NEO and Tikvah Home for Men we believe recovery involves giving back and serving others. sale. The very next week the owner excitedly shared about a showing that was scheduled. The following week the owner, with tears in her eyes, shared the condo was sold. To God be the glory!

Hearts to Hands:

JourneyMen

Three men came together long before Tikvah Home for Men accepted residents and discussed the need to begin a men's support group. Initially, a workbook was purchased to help guide us men. Our first chapter was on "Trust" and we quickly learned that God does have a sense of humor because all men have trust issues. We ended up answering only the first two questions in the workbooks and never looked at them again. It had nothing to do with the workbook material but everything to do with the Spirit answering our prayers. We always started and ended every meeting in prayer and asked God to help us as we journeyed through life and that is exactly what He has done and continues to this day. You might be asking "What is a JourneyMen?"

In the trades, a journeymen is one that trains or learns under a master contractor. We call ourselves the JourneyMen because we are learning under our master - Jesus Christ. Every Tuesday approximately thirty men from Tikvah and the surrounding

community come together and first share a free meal and then share our brokenness with one another. Every man struggles with hurts, habits and hang ups and Tikvah is a safe place to share anything without judgement. We believe "a problem shared is a problem cut in half" and when one man stumbles, their brothers in Christ are there to help them back up. The JourneyMen group is open to any male eighteen years of age and older.

In December of last year Justin embraced his recovery and decided to change people, places and things and move from his warm home town of Arizona to Ohio. He came to Tikvah Home for Men excited about the opportunity to experience snow for the first time in his life but only equipped with a sweatshirt and tennis shoes. One of the requirements at Tikvah is for everyone to attend church once a week. The resident can pick where and when they attend but they must share their experience at the weekly house meeting. Justin decided to attend Willoughby Bible Church located next door to Tikvah. God began to work through Pastor Bolton, the church elders and even the congregation as they all spoke life into Justin. Justin began to change from the inside out and we all observed these changes. After five months of attending church, Justin accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior and became a new creation. He asked to be baptized and both Pastor Bolton and Dennis, the Tikvah director, shared in this glorious event.

Another accomplishment or rebuilding milestone for Justin also happened at about the six month mark at Tikvah. Justin was able to finally obtain a driver's license. This was no easy task. He once held an Arizona license but it had been revoked due to poor choices on his part. He decided to make changes and finally accepted responsibility for his poor choices. He made the necessary restitution and ultimately received an Ohio driver's license and the freedom associated with driving privileges. Justin is living proof if you do the next right thing, good things will happen.
